  - a) Meningitis B is a serious bacterial infection of the brain
  - b) It is rare but can cause death and disability in those who are infected
  - c) The meningitis B vaccine is not yet routinely recommended for healthy adolescents
  - d) but is required by many colleges and universities for high risk groups
    - i) Teens and young adults in dorm settings
  - e) If you have a senior and are interested in having them vaccinated against meningitis b, please reach out to Student Health.

  - c) So far topics have been- inappropriate language, loud music/shared space/ brave behavior
- 3) Theft
  - a) Encourage students to play a part in prevention
    - i) Locks available from Mr. Weissberg
    - ii) stay organized
      - (1) often reported thefts are lost items
  - b) Theft does happen
    - i) Policy can be found in handbook
    - ii) Currently- investigate and return when possible,
      - (1) under \$100
        - (a) 5 demerits and 5 days restriction
      - (2) more than \$100
        - (a) 10 demerits and possible suspension, police may be involved
- 4) Work with Upper Campus Committee (UCC)
  - a) Led by Trisha Bessert- Recreation Coordinator
  - b) Selected by staff and peers to improve dorm life
  - c) UCC with be putting on a show called "Edging Out"
    - i) Was a pre covid event that is coming back

Alex Weissberg replied that Margo Livermore is our guidance counselor and works with students to get them ready, along with a volunteer, Selena, who goes in and out of classes sharing information, and will also work one on one with students in her office. We also have a Senior Futures class and Junior Advisory Class. Mr. Weissberg suggested he may make this topic the theme of his next Topic Tuesday: to remind students of all the resources available.

Suzzuk Huntington added that those who are not enrolled in the Senior Futures class are still invited to join in on the class unofficially when they need assistance.

    - iv) Observations have been held and lesson plans reviewed
  - c) We are looking at how MEHS notifies parents when there is the possibility of issues with content
  - d) Policies in progress
    - i) Possible review committee
    - ii) Using Anchorage School District as a starting model
