EMT1 – Emergency Medical Technician (students must be 17 or older by the first day of class to be eligible)

The Alaska EMT training program is 140 hours minimum. Students must be present for all classes (or make up time missed) in order to meet the requirements set out in state regulation. The MEHS EMT curriculum is aligned to the national EMT standards. Students must complete the State skills portfolio and pass the State written exam in order to earn certification. Students will earn 6 UAS credits for this class.

Grading:

This class is graded according to the standard A, B, C, NC percentage scale. Grades are broken down as follows:

50% Skills Checks / Participation / Scenarios 50% Quizzes

Attendance: EMT class has a unique requirement at MEHS. You must be present in class for nearly every period! This is because regulation states EMT1 classes must have 140+ hours of class time. We will have a few extra activities during weekends and/or after school that you may need to attend to get your 140 hours. (Please keep this in mind while scheduling appointments and travel.) If you're on a sports team, talk to me ASAP.

Age: State regulation requires students to be 17 years old at the start of class to earn Alaska EMT certification.

Class Information: This is EMT-1 Initial Course: 2211EMT1I27621

Reading: Your text is Prehospital Emergency Care, 11th Edition. It is critical that you keep up on reading. We will cover the highlights of each chapter, but you cannot rely on class presentations alone to pass your knowledge exam. (Expect about 50-100 pages a week.)

Testing: In order to be certified as an EMT, you must pass the written and complete the skills portfolio. The written exam will be a ~150 question computerized multiple choice test. The test will be on campus and proctored by another MEHS teacher. If you fail the written test on your first attempt, you will have an opportunity to retake it once at MEHS. (I will organize this for you.) After that, you are able to do a third retake, but we will not have time to complete this during your time at MEHS. I will strongly recommend you do some review instruction with an EMT instructor prior to a third attempt. You will need to schedule this on your own, but I will connect you with your regional EMS council. See 7 AAC 26.090 (In your "Alaska EMS laws" packet) for more details.
